Sample preparation for diseased plant specimens

For accurate diagnoses it is imperative that specimens are carefully selected, well presented and submitted with adequate information.

To ensure that samples arrive in the best possible quality, they need to be collected and dispatched early in the week (Monday or Tuesday) to avoid weekend delays in transit and examination.

Digital images

Images or scans of symptoms can allow for rapid diagnosis via email and also act as a backup in case samples do not arrive in a suitable condition. Take digital images that are representative of the range of symptoms that you are observing and email them to lisa.kelly@dpi.qld.gov.au along with the relevant crop details.

Selection of specimens

Select plants that show the full range of symptoms, i.e. slightly to severely affected. Include a healthy plant for comparison. Collect whole plants if practicable or a representative portion of the affected plant. For seedling and root diseases, include roots and some soil from the root zone. Ensure that free moisture is removed from the specimens, particularly leaves.

Preservation and packaging

Immediately upon collection, fresh samples need to be placed in a slightly inflated plastic bag in which there is a small amount of moisture (e.g. add slightly moist paper towel). Some pathogens are best placed in a paper bag, so we advise keeping some samples in paper bag also. Keep samples cool and post as quickly as possible. DO NOT leave samples exposed in a vehicle.

Labelling

Include a copy of the 'Plant Disease Enquiry' sheet within the package but not within the sample bag. If sending multiple samples from different locations, ensure the bags and the 'Plant Disease Enquiry' sheets are identifiable by number.

Dispatch

Specimens should be sent ASAP after collection via express post or courier to:
